

Fernando de Mateo

- Is an economist by training, holding a B.A. from the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM), a M.A. from El Colegio de México, and a M.A. from The Johns Hopkins University.
- Currently, he is the Director General of Evaluation of Economic Policies at the Secretaría de Economía, and Coordinator of the Diploma on Trade Negotiations at El Colegio de México.
- De Mateo was Ambassador of Mexico to the World Trade Organization from 2004 to 2016. He was the chairman of the General Council in 2015-16. Previously, he chaired the Dispute Settlement Body and, during 9 years, was chairman of the negotiating group on services. For several years he also chaired the Trade Council of the Organisation of Economic Cooperation and Development.
- De Mateo was the chief negotiator in the Free Trade Agreement of the Americas, and in the free trade agreements of Mexico with the EFTA countries, and with Uruguay. He was the national coordinator in the negotiations of the FTA with the European Union. De Mateo was the services negotiator in NAFTA and in the Uruguay Round of the GATT.
- He has served in different positions in the Mexican Government, in the Mexican Institute on Foreign Trade, and in the Bank of Mexico.
- De Mateo has written extensively on international economics in books and specialized journals.
